Pastor's Message

What does the Holy Spirit look like?

In 1935, the Rev. Henry H. Tweedy, a Congregational clergyman, penned the words of a beautiful hymn for Pentecost, "O Spirit of the living God, thou light and fire divine, descend upon thy church once more and make it truly thine. Fill it with love and joy and power, with righteousness and peace; till Christ shall dwell in human hearts, and sin and sorrow cease." Tweedy uses words like "light, fire, love, joy, power, righteousness, peace, wind of God, wisdom" and so much more to describe the Holy Spirit. In the Spirit, we find the very gift of life, breath, and strength.



With Pentecost and Confirmation coming up on May 19, it seems appropriate that throughout this month, we are asking ourselves, "So what does the Holy Spirit look like?" Like wind, fire, power, and so much more, it can be hard to pin down the Spirit of God. On the other hand, the signs of the Spirit's presence around us are unmistakable for those with eyes to see and hearts to respond to God's work among us. In the eyes of our children, in a song sung by the choir, in a note from a friend, in a hug from a sibling in Christ, or through a can of food at the food pantry, we remember and remind others that we are not alone for God is with us. This is the work of the Spirit that continues to mold us and transform us.

So what are you waiting for? How is it that you see the Spirit at work in your life? Better yet, how are you being moved by the Spirit to bring life and love; to re-present God's presence in the world around you? I can't wait to see you in worship as we explore how God is moving among us at St. Paul's.

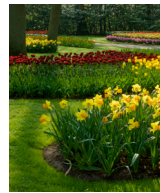

Mission Challenge 2024

Raise \$20,000 for Lighthouse Family Shelter in Pontiac

Mission Council is pleased to report we are **half way to our goal** to raise money to convert first floor restrooms at Lighthouse Family Shelter to be wheelchair accessible.



Lighthouse Family Shelter houses 18 families, on average 60 people. The Family Shelter is intended to be a short-term fix, with the goal being to set the families up with permanent housing. Upon their arrival the families are assigned a case worker who helps them during the transition. The program has a 95% success rate for families staying in the permanent housing for two years after assignment.
